TREASURER'S REPORT By Brian Quinn

- July figures:
 - July Net Operating Income a surplus of \$3,888
 - o July Net Income a surplus of \$4,178
 - July YTD Net Operating Income a deficit of \$6,844
 - July YTD Net Income a surplus of \$892
 - July in past years often a surplus. In 2023 comparison July YTD Net Income was deficit of \$16,444
 - Major factor is FMM \$22,872 contributed
- Pledge figures \$132,197 roughly 8% over projection
- We have 3 restricted funds at this time: (in total 16,285 with 12,686 marked for repairs)
 - Repair Restricted \$1607 remaining
 - VBS grant remaining \$3599 some bills from this year have yet to be submitted
 - o Faith Moves Mountains \$11,079 remaining paid \$5k initial payment for door in June
- Balance Sheet:
 - Investment fund now with last statement \$95,623
 - Mortgage \$61,008 with monthly payment now \$1683
 - Assets Liabilities \$145,990
- Insurance increasing by 20% now yearly payments amount to \$35,557 last year was \$29,717 - reason cited was increased volume of claims
 Mid July thru late Sept pledges trend significantly lower - last year deficit of -20K

The week was a big success! During the community celebration we shared the highlight video of the week's activities and enjoyed popcorn.


VBS is blessed with an amazing team. We are all looking forward to next year!
