VESTRY VIEWS By June Gerbracht

What do you appreciate about The Church of St. Jude?

My response to this question is that it's an intergenerational community. During much of my Social Work professional life I worked with senior adults in the community; work which was most often associated with religious organizations. Churches and temples are by their very natures intergenerational. It is often argued that they are the only naturally inter-generational organizations in our society.

My husband and I joined St. Jude's when we had three young children – later adding a fourth. When I was teaching Sunday School, and obviously very pregnant, I was approached by Mary LaDuca (she had adult children) and asked what I was going to do about my toddler class while I was on "maternity leave". On the spot, she volunteered to take over and teach a rambunctious group of 12 little boys and girls. When I was able to return, Mary moved on up to an older class and continued teaching Sunday School for many years (even recruiting her husband Frank to teach).

My children all grew up at St. Jude's. Each was fortunate to have a special relationship with a non-family member adult within the parish. Fred (and the other boys his age all knew that they were special and could do no wrong (?) in Mary LaDuca's eyes; Missy had Jan Commentz to guide her through becoming an acolyte - as well as a variety of vocal activities both within and outside the parish; Amy as a teenager became great friends with Edna Nichols who was well into her eighties at the time (when a parishioner "complimented" her on how nice she was to Mrs. Nichols – Amy's indignant response was, "She's the most interesting person at St. Jude's"; and Rob as a teen (who is now a Marine Corps Colonel) followed Dusty Crawford (who had become the church super handyman in retirement) around, learning how to become a Mr. Fixit. Dusty was a World War II Marine Corps veteran and one of Rob's biggest regrets was not being able to attend Dusty's funeral because he was stationed in Afghanistan.

Now as an older Senior Adult, and the oldest vestry person, I appreciate the opportunity to be a part of a truly intergenerational parish family, interacting with parishioners of all ages.

I ask you to think about what you appreciate most about the Church of St. Jude. Why not consider sharing your thoughts with fellow parishioners in a future newsletter.

<u>WELCOME BACK SUNDAY SCHOOL</u> By Barbara Arnold Installation of Sunday School teachers


We are thrilled to welcome back our Sunday School teachers. They were recognized after the service as they asked for God's blessings and renewed their commitment to teach in front of the congregation.


